## Closing Remarks

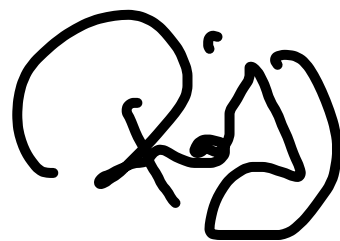
