I welcome you to the University of Delhi and to Shivaji College. The University of Delhi is one of the premium universities in India and has an international reputation; Shivaji College is a constituent college of the university and features among its foremost colleges. Established in 1961, Shivaji College was the fulfilment of a dream seen by Shri Punjabrao

Deshmukh, the then Union Minister of Agriculture in the Government of India, and embodies the values of the great Indian icon Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj. The college works towards the holistic development of the students and takes concrete measures, annually, for incremental growth of the quality of education that it imparts. The college has been accredited with an "A" Grade by NAAC. Shivaji College has also achieved a significant milestone in rising from NIRF rank 71 to rank 49 in the last year. Shivaji College is ranked 23rd in the Commerce stream, 32nd in the Science stream, and 36th in Arts and Humanities in the India Today – MDRA's Best Colleges Survey 2025 at All India Level. Among Delhi Colleges, our ranking is 14th in Commerce, 15th in Science and 16th in Humanities stream, according to India Today-MDRA survey. Another achievement is the 8th rank in B.A. (H) Hindi by the India Today-MDRA survey.

Shivaji College has recently completed the process of appointing around 100 faculty members on a permanent basis and promoted existing faculty members to higher designations as per the regulations of the University of Delhi. At present, we have 15 research projects running as part of the extramural and intramural schemes. The Principal's Internship Scheme, introduced in 2024-25, provides hands-on training to students on the various aspects of administrative functioning. With the recent addition of new auditoria, science labs, the Jijabai Academic Block, and the Special Skill Centre, the college is all set to implement the 4<sup>th</sup> year of the UGCF curricula and all that is required for comprehensive implementation of NEP.

Our students have made their mark in the world of sports on the national level. The sprawling and well-maintained sports ground of our college houses a football court, a volleyball court, a basketball court, and a cricket ground.

The college also has a vibrant cultural atmosphere. Various students' societies promote Bharatiya tradition and teach the students the values of patriotism. The annual cultural fest Vibrations, the annual Jijabai Awards for outstanding achievers in social upliftment, Shivaji Jayanti celebrations, and many such events have provided platforms for students to learn and display their talent. In addition, the NSS and the NCC (girls and boys) wings of the college contribute towards orienting young minds towards the values of Rashtra dharma.

I am sure your time at Shivaji College will be enriching, and the college will be truly instrumental in transforming your life.

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Dr. Panjabrao Deshmukh

Shivaji College, a premier co-educational constituent college of the University of Delhi, was established in 1961 under the aegis of the Ministry of Education and according to the vision of the distinguished educationist and visionary, Dr. Panjabrao Deshmukh, India's first Agriculture Minister. Named after the legendary Maratha warrior king Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, the college stands as a tribute to valour, wisdom, and cultural rootedness. Over the decades, it has evolved into a dynamic centre of academic excellence and holistic student development, firmly grounded in the ethos of Bhāratīya Saṃskṛti.

Nestled in a serene 10.35-acre campus in Raja Garden, New Delhi, Shivaji College offers 20 undergraduate and 3 postgraduate programmes across disciplines such as sciences, humanities, and commerce, catering to over 4000 students and supported by more than 150 dedicated faculty members. The college is widely recognised for its innovative pedagogy, interdisciplinary curriculum, and commitment to social equity, ecological sustainability, and value-based education. Its motto, "Amritam tu Vidya" (Knowledge is Immortal), drawn from the Mundaka Upanishad, encapsulates its vision of education as a means of character formation and nation-building.

Shivaji College stands at the forefront of academic and institutional innovation. Over the last two years, the college has introduced many new schemes and measures for quality enhancement. The Principal Internship Scheme (PIS), modelled after the University of Delhi's Vice Chancellor Internship Scheme, was launched in 2024–25 to provide students with hands-on exposure to institutional processes and real-world functioning. Fifty students successfully completed the summer internship (June 24 – July 31, 2024), while 28 students undertook extended internships during the academic session beginning September 20, 2024.



In celebration of the 350th coronation anniversary of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, the college instituted the Shivraj Bhushan Award to honour 25 years of dedicated service. On June 6, 2024, the award was conferred upon 20 teaching staff members—including Principal Prof. Virender Bhardwaj—and 28 non-teaching staff members, reflecting the institution's deep respect for loyalty and legacy.





Environmental sustainability is a hallmark of the college's ethos. The campus houses a solar power plant generating over 95,000 kWh annually, a sewage treatment plant processing 27,62,162.16 litres per year (the first of its kind in Delhi University), and rainwater harvesting units with a capacity of 1.2 lakh litres annually. Additionally, bio-composting facilities produce 2,080 kg of compost per year, and the campus maintains a tree plantation drive with 450+ trees. The college also hosts a revived herbal garden with operational beehives, along with paper and food waste recycling systems, a strict ban on single-use plastic, LED lighting, and a vehicle-free green zone, collectively ensuring ecological harmony.


Research and innovation are foundational pillars of the college. In 2024–25, the Intramural Research Scheme funded five new multidisciplinary projects, with funding increased from ₹30,000 to ₹1,00,000 per project. The projects include Restoring and Integrating Indian Knowledge Systems: A Bhagavad Gita Perspective; Revisiting the Partition of India through Art and Literature; Socio-Economic Development and Cultural Identity of the Kol Tribe (Chitrakoot, MP); Anthrax Vaccine Development Using Bacillus anthracis Mutants; and Microwave-Assisted Synthesis of Purine Analogues. Dedicated research laboratories have been established in the Jijabai Academic Block, while the launch of Shivraj 350: Multidisciplinary Journal has further cemented the college's research credentials.



Value-added education remains a priority through numerous Add-on and Certificate Courses, including interdisciplinary and inter-college programmes like Poultry Farming: A Complete Guide, Role of Plants in Natural Resource Conservation, Mental Ability and Logical Reasoning, Advanced Electoral Studies & Voting Behaviour Analysis, Excel & Python for Data Analysis and Visualisation, Beginner's Module on Financial Literacy, Understanding Chemistry Through Software, Digital Forensics and

Cyber Intelligence, and LaTeX for Academic Writing. Collaborations with IIT Bombay's Spoken Tutorial provide certifications in Python, LaTeX, and Arduino. The college also offers part-time certificate courses in French and German through the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, University of Delhi, and an entrepreneurship course titled App Development using Flutter under Udhmodaya Shivaji College in collaboration with Samarth Bharat.

The Women's Development Cell (WDC), in addition to the Jijabai Achievers' Awards that it has been conferring annually since 2010 for excellence in community upliftment, sustainability, and culture, introduced two new awards in 2024–25: the Jijabai Young Achievers Award and the Jijabai Employee Recognition Award.



Student welfare is further strengthened through substantial fee concessions totalling ₹11,97,200 granted to 151 students, including full waivers for 85 students (30 PwD, 52 orphaned, and 3 meritorious). The HANA Scholarships from South Korea provided ₹42,358 each to 16 deserving students.

The college continuously strives to implement its Vision and Mission effectively through various initiatives. Notably, the Industrial Development Plan (IDP) is actively implemented within the college, aiming to align institutional growth with the objectives of fostering academic enrichment and overall development. This plan reflects the college's dedication to empowering its community, promoting innovative practices, and nurturing a dynamic environment that supports learning and personal growth.

Infrastructure development has seen significant expansion. The Jijabai Academic Block houses air-conditioned departmental rooms and state-of-the-art laboratories for Biochemistry, Botany, Chemistry, English, and Political Science. Departments of Physics and Environmental Science have been relocated to the old building. New labs in Biochemistry, Chemistry, Zoology, and Computer Science (equipped with advanced ICT tools) have been established, and a GIS Laboratory has been set up in the Geography Department. The newly established Skill Enhancement Center located on the ground floor of the Jijabai Block will work towards generating skilled and employable students for the society.

The college boasts five newly named auditoriums—Chanakya Sabhagar, Tanaji Malusare Auditorium, Chhatrapati Sambhaji Auditorium, Peshwa Bajirao Auditorium, and Samarth Guru Ramdas Hall—which were ceremonially inaugurated during Shivaji Jayanti 2025 by Smt. Vijaya Rahatkar, Chairperson, National Commission for Women.



ICT infrastructure has been significantly enhanced with 10 new Wi-Fi routers installed in key locations (library, staffroom, Bursar's office, Jijabai auditorium, and departmental rooms), LAN connectivity enabled on the second and third floors of the Jijabai Block, 21 new computers, and 10 projector screens installed across the campus.

Student amenities have also been upgraded: the Girls' Common Room now includes AC, a sanitary pad dispenser, and a refrigerator; the Boys' Common Room is newly furnished; the canteen features a renovated kitchen and washing area; eight new water coolers have been installed; sports facilities have been improved with a renovated basketball court and a new volleyball court; and three new hoardings have been added for enhanced visibility and branding.

The Bhushan Granthalaya library expanded its collection with 1,386 new books in 2024–25, bringing the total to 83,983 books, alongside 7 journals, 18 magazines, and a dedicated section on Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj.

Shivaji College also takes pride in its vibrant alumni network through the Shivaji College Alumni Association (SCAA), officially registered under the Societies Registration Act on September 17, 2024. Its distinguished members include professionals like Sh. D.K. Sharma, I.G. (Retd.), and academic leaders across the University of Delhi.

In alignment with the national vision of Viksit Bharat @2047, Shivaji College envisions its role as a transformative institution shaping the thought leaders, innovators, and change-makers of tomorrow. Through a seamless blend of tradition and modernity, scholarship and service, pedagogy and praxis, the college upholds its commitment to indigenous knowledge systems, sustainable development, research-driven pedagogy, and inclusive growth. Rooted deeply in Bhāratīya Samskrti and guided by the ideals of holistic education, Shivaji College remains dedicated to building a resilient, equitable, and enlightened Bharat by 2047.





#### **VISION**

Keeping in mind the essence of the college's motto, "Amritam Tu Vidya" (Knowledge is Eternal), Shivaji College is envisioned as a dynamic centre of higher learning and holistic development. Shivaji College stands as a distinguished institution deeply rooted in Bhāratīya Saṃskṛti and the sacred pursuit of knowledge, wisdom, character-building, and self-realisation, echoing the Upanishadic teaching:

"विद्यया अमृतमश्रुते।" (Mundaka Upanishad 1.2.12) "Through knowledge, one attains immortality."

True Vidya in Bhāratīya Saṃskṛti is revered as a means to transcend the material world and achieve intellectual, volitional (ichhā), and spiritual fulfilment. Rooted in this philosophy, Shivaji College remains committed to harmonising jñāna (knowledge), karma (action), ichhā (aspiration), and dharma (righteous duty), fostering academic excellence, cultural pride, and a profound sense of national and moral responsibility.

The institution creates a nurturing, progressive, and congenial environment conducive to innovation and creativity, where freedom of thought, expression, and cultural rootedness flourish. It strives continually to produce generation after generation of optimistic, resourceful, committed, passionate, and ethically grounded future leaders who can transform society and the nation positively in every respect.

#### **MISSION**

Aligned with its vision, the mission of the college is to extend learning beyond conventional boundaries, providing experiential, interdisciplinary, and socially engaged education aimed at producing intellectually curious, environmentally conscious, and morally responsible individuals through the following core objectives:

#### **ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AND INQUIRY-DRIVEN ENVIRONMENT:**

To foster a rigorous, inquiry-driven academic atmosphere promoting research, interdisciplinary learning, and integration of Bharatiya knowledge systems with contemporary scientific advancements. The college currently offers 20 undergraduate and 3 postgraduate courses across 18 departments, serving over 4087 students.

#### INCLUSIVITY, DEMOCRACY, AND CULTURAL DIVERSITY:

To nurture democratic values, social inclusivity, and respect for cultural diversity, ensure equitable opportunities for students who are differently abled or from economically weaker/ marginalised backgrounds, through targeted programmes and financial aid.

#### **GENDER SENSITIVITY AND INTERSECTIONALITY:**

To instill sensitivity towards gender issues and intersectionality, the college encourages representation and empowerment of women and underrepresented communities through initiatives such as the Jijabai Awards, Women's Development Cell (WDC), and equal opportunity programmes.

#### **ECOLOGICAL SUSTAINABILITY:**

To embed ecological consciousness and sustainability, the college undertakes substantial campus initiatives, including a solar power plant, a 27 lakh+ litre sewage treatment plant, RO wastewater recycling, composting and vermicomposting units, the introduction of a beehive in the herbal garden, energy-efficient LED lighting, responsible e-waste disposal, and maintaining a vehicle-free zone.

#### **CO-CURRICULAR AND CULTURAL ENGAGEMENT:**

To encourage vibrant co-curricular engagement, the college regularly organizes cultural events such as Vibrations 2025, Rajyabhishek Mahotsav, and Shivaji Jayanti, complemented by student-led societies, inter-departmental festivals, and extensive sports tournaments.

#### **EXPERIENTIAL AND INDUSTRY-ORIENTED EDUCATION:**

To bridge the gap between theory and practice, the college encourages collaborative initiatives such as the Principal Internship Scheme (benefiting 43 students in 2024–25 with summer and year-long internships), interdisciplinary value-added courses (Eco-Friendly Practices, Data Analysis, Poultry Farming, Drone Technology), and industry-oriented MoUs with institutions like Samarth Bharat under the Career Development Centre (CDC) and the entrepreneurship cell, Udhmodya Shivaji College.

#### RESEARCH. INNOVATION. AND INTELLECTUAL EXCHANGE:

To foster research and innovation, the college has enhanced intramural research funding (from ₹30,000 to ₹1,00,000), supports 5 new interdisciplinary research projects annually, is conducting 4 Extramural research projects funded by prestigious agencies, is securing patents in AI-driven analytics, IoT, and nanotechnology, and has launched Shivraj 350: Multidisciplinary Journal as a premier platform for scholarly discourse.

#### INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT AND TECHNOLOGICAL ADVANCEMENTS:

To strengthen academic and administrative infrastructure. The latest measures towards this have been in the direction of modernising laboratories (Geography and Biochemistry), upgrading ICT-enabled classrooms, installing additional Wi-Fi routers, surveillance cameras, acquiring Adobe Creative Cloud licenses for faculty, and establishing dedicated spaces honouring Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj in Bhushan Granthalaya. Additionally, the college has ceremonially named five state-of-the-art auditoriums after great historical personalities—Chanakya, Peshwa Bajirao, Chhatrapati Sambhaji, Tanaji Malusare, and Samarth Guru Ramdas. The Infrastructural Development Plan (IDP) implemented in the college works in complete alignment with the Vision and Mission of the college.

#### STUDENT FINANCIAL SUPPORT AND SCHOLARSHIPS:

The college consistently offers financial assistance to students. Some recent efforts in this direction have been in the form of ₹29,04,690 given in scholarships to 696 students (2023–24) and ₹11,97,200 to 151 students (2024–25), including full waivers for differently-abled, orphaned, or high-achieving students, along with targeted support from international benefactors such as the HANA Financial Group of South Korea and local endowments like the Umrao Singh Sushila Devi Scholarship.

#### STUDENT AND ALUMNI RECOGNITION:

To celebrate significant student and alumni achievements, the college recently honoured Commerce gold medallist Ashutosh as the recipient of the prestigious 'Shivaji Ratna,' IIT JAM achiever Priyanshu (AIR-18), sports champions in DU Inter-College Championships, placements offering up to ₹24 LPA at Dhanguard Dubai, and securing significant accolades such as a ₹1,00,000 prize at Photothon 2025.

#### **FACULTY ADVANCEMENT AND INSTITUTIONAL LEADERSHIP:**

To support continuous professional growth, the college regularly promotes teachers according to UGC norms, encourages faculty participation in international conferences, encourages the faculty to take up distinguished leadership positions within Delhi University, thereby enhancing the institutional reputation and influence.

### **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY:**

The college actively engages students through National Service Scheme (NSS) and National Cadet Corps (NCC), organises extensive community outreach programmes focused on environmental sustainability, health awareness, social responsibility, and national pride through events like Republic Day parades, leadership camps, and the commemoration of other significant days like the Kargil Vijay Diwas and the International Yoga Day.

#### **COLLABORATIVE ACADEMIC INITIATIVES:**

The college consistently undertakes impactful academic initiatives, including international conferences such as "Viksit Bharat @2047" and the Shaikshik Foundation International Conference 2025, reinforcing Bharatiya epistemologies, indigenous knowledge systems, innovation, and sustainability, drawing national and international participants.

#### **SPORTS, WELLNESS, AND CAMPUS AMENITIES:**

To enhance campus amenities by renovating sports facilities (basketball courts, cricket tournaments, athletics meets), upgrading common rooms (Girls' Common Room with sanitary dispensers and refrigerators, Boys' Common Room), installing clean drinking water facilities, and improving canteen hygiene to foster an inclusive and supportive learning environment.

As Shivaji College progresses with its Grade 'A' NAAC accreditation and an impressive 49th rank in NIRF rankings, it continues to build upon its legacy of academic excellence, innovative research, holistic student development, community engagement, and ecological stewardship. The institution remains committed to setting exemplary benchmarks in higher education and research, consistently guided by its profound philosophical vision and expansive, forward-looking mission.



















# FEW GLIMPSES OF THE CULTURAL PROGRAMMES















#### REPUTED FACULTY

Shivaji College has a dedicated and dynamic faculty that fosters holistic development by encouraging students to think beyond textbooks and engage with real-world issues. Several faculty members supervise Ph.D. scholars and are actively involved in UGC-funded research and university-sponsored Innovation Projects. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) plays a key role in maintaining academic standards and monitoring student progress, ensuring a culture of continuous improvement and excellence in teaching.

#### **BHUSHAN GRANTHALYA: COLLEGE LIBRARY**

The college library has 82,575 books and subscribes to 7 print journals. All the books are bar-coded and have RFID tags. The library has KOHA Library Software since 2019. It has one reading hall for students (seating capacity of 90), and two halls with computer facilities: one for students (seating capacity of 75) and another for faculty (seating capacity of 15). There are 3 Angles (Talking Digital Portable Daisy Players), 29 tape recorders, 9 I-PODs, 2 Braille kits, 1 Lex Air (Portable Camera Reading System), and Notebook Computer for visually challenged students.



#### **SPORTS AND GAMES**

Shivaji College boasts of a diverse range of sports and games facilities that cater to the needs of its students. The college is equipped with a well-maintained sports complex comprising a football field, basketball court, volleyball court, tennis court, cricket ground, and indoor facilities for chess. Other facilities such as flood lights, locker/ changing rooms, store room, grounds-men room and washrooms are also available. Students actively participate in various inter-college and intracollege tournaments, showcasing their skills and sportsmanship. The college encourages a healthy balance between academics and sports, providing opportunities for students to excel in their chosen disciplines both on and off the field. Other facilities such as flood lights, locker/ changing rooms, store room, grounds-men room and washrooms are also available.



### **COLLEGE CAFETERIA**

The college cafeteria is a fully air-conditioned popular student hangout offering hygienic, affordable food in a lively setting. A Bru kiosk and a Vadilal booth on campus further add to the variety of snacks and beverages available.

#### LEISURE AND RECREATION

The college offers fully furnished and air conditioned Girls' and Boys' Common Rooms to support student welfare and engagement. These spaces provide a comfortable setting for students to relax, interact, and participate in informal activities.

#### **LABORATORIES**

The college is equipped with modern and efficiently managed laboratories for science and humanities courses offered, such as Physics, Chemistry, Zoology, Geography, Biochemistry, and Botany. There are 9 laboratories in the old building, two each in Physics (with a dark room in each laboratory), Botany, Zoology, and Chemistry departments. There are two laboratories in the department of Geography: equipped with GIS and remote sensing laboratory and a state Cartography laboratory for mapmaking and spatial visualization. There are four instrumentation laboratories, one each in the Botany, Biochemistry, Chemistry, and Physics departments, and one museum in the Zoology department. In addition to these, there are four computer laboratories. All laboratories are Wi-Fi enabled and equipped with projectors. Additionally, new laboratories were assigned in Jijabai Academic Block to the Departments of Biochemistry, Chemistry, Zoology, and Computer Science with the latest state-of-the-art computers.

#### **MAGAZINE**

The college magazine, Shivraj, provides a platform for young minds to share their experiences, thoughts, and opinions. The magazine publishes contributions from students and teachers in English, Hindi, and Sanskrit. Articles, poems, essays, and stories display the literary skills of students across various disciplines. The participation of students is actively encouraged by holding a cover design competition, which provides creative input in bringing out the magazine

#### **COLLEGE AUDITORIUMS**

The college has four auditoriums: Peshwa Bajirao Auditorium, Chhatrapati Sambhaji Auditorium, and Tanaji Malusare Auditorium in the new building, and additionally Chanakya Sabhaghar in the old building. The auditoriums are well-equipped with a state-of-the-art audio-visual system, a projector, and stage lighting arrangements. They are the centre for various extracurricular, cultural, and educational activities like seminars, talks, debates, plays, movie screenings, and departmental festivals. For many students, the auditoriums provide the stage where they overcome their stage fright and learn to give their first performances in their college life.

#### **RESEARCH AVENUES AND OPPORTUNITIES**

The college promotes interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary research through innovation projects that entail research grants. There are also research laboratories in the new Jijabai academic block. Free Wi-Fi login ensures that the students access e-journals and online databases subscribed to by the University of Delhi.

#### FOREIGN LANGUAGE CERTIFICATE COURSES IN GERMAN AND FRENCH

The Add-on and Value-Added Courses Committee of Shivaji College was constituted to conduct courses that provide students with an extensive array of learning opportunities beyond their regular curriculum. The courses are designed to go beyond the traditional academic scope, providing invaluable insights and practical skills.

The college offers certificate courses in German and French, which are open to students of all streams. This course is for a duration of two semesters, and classes are held three times a week. Students who join this course have to fulfil the attendance criteria of 66 percent to appear for the end-semester examination. On successful completion of two semesters, the student is awarded a certificate by the University of Delhi.

#### STUDENT INFORMATION SYSTEM

Shivaji Platform for Academic Connect and Empowerment (SPACE) is a state-of-the-art ERP system. It is a digital platform for all students that provides online access to monitor attendance and internal assessment.

#### **BANKING FACILITY**

The Central Bank of India has a branch within the college premises. Staff and students can open accounts and avail themselves of other banking facilities.

#### **XEROX FACILITY**

There are two Xerox centres within the college, where students can use photocopying and bookbinding facilities at a nominal rate. One photocopy outlet is adjacent to the main gate, and the other operates from the library premises.

## **WORLD UNIVERSITY SERVICE (WUS) HEALTH CENTRE**

The college has a WUS Health Centre on the premises for students and university members. Students can avail health facilities - emergency services, free consultation, and free medical benefits - at a nominal rate of Rs. 120/- annually.

## **ICT-ENABLED AND FUTURE-READY CAMPUS**

Shivaji College is committed to integrating technology into education and campus operations. The college has upgraded its ICT infrastructure with newly installed and refurbished projectors, advanced presentation systems, and the upcoming addition of 21 new computers. WiFi connectivity has been significantly enhanced with the installation of routers and LAN access across multiple floors, ensuring seamless internet access. A network of CCTV cameras strengthens campus security, making the college both digitally empowered and future-ready.

#### SKILL DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

Shivaji College has been granted a Skill Development Centre (SDC) for Python Programming and Data Analysis to equip students with in-demand technical skills through hands-on training in Python, data handling, and data visualization. Aligned with the vision of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the Centre offers flexible and inclusive learning opportunities for students across all disciplines. With a strong emphasis on employability, the SDC aims to bridge the gap between academic learning and real-world application.

#### **GREEN INITIATIVES**

Shivaji College champions sustainability through composting units, waste recycling, a solar power plant, and a state-of-the-art sewage treatment system. The campus features RO waste-water reuse, a beehive in the herbal garden, LED lighting, e-waste disposal, and a vehicle-free zone—reflecting its strong commitment to a green, eco-friendly environment.

#### HARMONIOUS ENVIRONMENT

The college authorities have installed a complaint box for students outside the principal's office, where grievances related to sexual harassment, ragging, and eve-teasing can be submitted. The college campus is a smoke-free and vehicle-free zone, which provides a healthy environment for students' well-being.



#### ADD-ON AND VALUE-ADDED COURSES COMMITTEE

The Add-on and Value-Added Courses Committee at Shivaji College offers programs that extend beyond the traditional academic curriculum, equipping students with valuable insights and practical skills. During the 2024–25 academic session, the college successfully conducted eight interdisciplinary and inter-college add-on courses. As an academic partner of the Spoken Tutorial project by IIT Bombay, Shivaji College facilitated six self-paced courses (Python, LaTeX, Arduino, R, Gnuplot, and Avogadro) for both students and faculty.

Additionally, a self-paced National Level Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on MOODLE LMS was organized under this collaboration. The college also offered part-time certificate courses in French and German, in association with the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, University of Delhi. Under a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Sherlock Institute of Forensic Science, India, a certificate course on "Forensic Science and Criminal Investigation" is being offered, open to all bonafide Indian nationals. Additionally, in collaboration with E&ICT Academy, IIT Kanpur, a course on "Advanced Excel with Data Visualization" is currently being conducted for students.



#### **ALUMNI RELATIONS COMMITTEE**

The Alumni Relations Committee (ARC) has been established to serve as a liaison between college alumni and current students. It helps to foster a lively and engaged alumni network that promotes the interchange of interests, opportunities, information, and resources for student growth and development. To this end, the ARC has been actively involved in various initiatives such as the Lecture Series, where distinguished alumni are invited to share their experiences and knowledge to inspire and encourage students in their future aspirations; the Student Mentorship Program, under which notable alumni mentor students on specific topics, including government fellowships and further education programs; and Know Your Alumni, where students create podcasts featuring notable alumni and publish them. The Social Media Series 'Humans of Shivaji' include conversations with young alumni, and 'My Experience with Internships' features experiences of students who engage in internship programs throughout their undergraduate education. Our annual event, 'Alumni Meet,' allows alumni to reconnect with their former institution, deepen relationships, and encourage current students.

On September 17, 2024, the Shivaji College Alumni Association was created under the Societies Registration Act of 1860 (Reg. No. SOCIETY/WEST/2024/8902807). The Alumni Relations Committee and Shivaji College Alumni Association (SCAA) collaborate to raise finances and promote college welfare and progress.





#### CENTRE FOR ENVIRONMENT AND DISASTER MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Centre for Environment and Disaster Management (CEDM) at Shivaji College, University of Delhi, is a crucial centre dedicated to advancing research, education, and practices in environmental sustainability and disaster resilience. CEDM focuses on interdisciplinary approaches to address pressing environmental challenges and disaster risks, fostering a comprehensive understanding of the interplay between human activities and natural systems. Through its initiatives, the centre aims to cultivate awareness, promote sustainable practices, and develop strategies for effective disaster management. The Centre believes that disaster risk reduction is possible only through promotion of a "Culture of Prevention" involving all stakeholders. By engaging students, faculty, and the broader community, CEDM strives to create a knowledgeable and proactive society capable of mitigating environmental issues and enhancing disaster preparedness and response.

#### **COLLEGE RESEARCH AND INNOVATION CELL**

The College Research and Innovation Cell (CRIC) at Shivaji College, University of Delhi, is a dynamic initiative that fosters a robust research ecosystem by encouraging faculty and students to engage in interdisciplinary research and innovative projects.

Key initiatives include

- Annual Research Fest—Srijan: The flagship event of CRIC, Srijan, provides a platform for students and faculty to showcase their research findings.
- Minor Research Projects: In the academic session 2024-25, the Cell sanctioned five Minor Research
  Projects under the Intramural Research Scheme, with each project receiving a grant of Rs. 1 lakh.
  This initiative supports faculty members in pursuing impactful research endeavors along with
  students.
- Publication of 'Shivraj 350: Multidisciplinary Journal': To further academic excellence, CRIC has launched Shivraj 350, a multidisciplinary journal that aims to publish cutting-edge research across diverse fields of study.

CRIC regularly invites distinguished academicians and industry experts to share insights on contemporary research challenges and opportunities. By promoting interdisciplinary collaboration, offering funding support, and organizing knowledge-sharing events, the Cell plays a pivotal role in advancing academic research and innovation within the institution.





#### **CULTURAL COMMITTEE**

The Cultural Committee of college stands as a beacon of artistic and aesthetic expression, offering students abundant opportunities to showcase their diverse talents through its seven dynamic societies. Throughout the academic year, the Cultural Committee orchestrates a variety of enriching programmes, beginning with Orientation Programme designed to seamlessly integrate freshers into the college community. Patriotic and entertaining performances are put together to celebrate Independence Day. In partnership with SPIC MACAY, the college immerses students in the rich and diverse cultural heritage of India, featuring classical dance and music performances.





The pinnacle of the activities of the Cultural Committee is the annual cultural festival, VIBRATIONS. This festival draws participants from various institutions who compete in events spanning debating, music, fashion, dance, fine arts, photography, and theatre, all within a spirited and supportive atmosphere. The festival culminates in a grand star-night finale. Each society within the Cultural Committee conducts auditions for new members at the beginning of the academic year. The societies are as follows:





#### **BIZARRE - THE FASHION SOCIETY**

Bizarre attracts extensive student participation and stages performances that rival professional shows. Fashion presentations are woven with socially relevant themes, garnering widespread acclaim. The society organizes "Panache", a major competitive event drawing numerous teams. Bizarre is highly awarded society in both intra and inter-university competitions.

#### **DICTUM - THE PUBLIC SPEAKING SOCIETY**

Dictum offers a unique platform for students to exchange ideas through parliamentary and conventional debating formats in both English and Hindi. The society hosts prestigious annual competitions, such as "The Shivaji Bhonsle Debate Competition", "Jijabai Paramparik Vad-Vivad Pratiyogita" and "Athena", which enjoy high popularity within the university circuit, receive a high turnout and elicit enthusiastic response.

#### SHUTTERBUGS - THE PHOTOGRAPHY AND FILMMAKING SOCIETY

Shutterbugs, the Photography and Film making Society, develops the skills of its members to a professional level, with their work receiving accolades at numerous events. The society works on advanced post-processing techniques, organizes photography trips across the country, and hosts interactive sessions with experienced photographers and filmmakers. Shutterbugs' annual event, "Cinedrome", features a variety of competitive activities.

#### **VAYAM - THE THEATRE SOCIETY**

Vayam is one of the most distinguished theatre groups at the University of Delhi, with an impressive array of awards. The society has been recognized for best team performances, scripts, direction, music, and acting, Vayam has performed at renowned venues such as NSD, Prithvi Theatre, Siri Fort Auditorium, and Kamani Auditorium. Vayam organises its annual event "Udghosh" and receives substantial media coverage.

#### **VIBGYOR - THE FINE ARTS SOCIETY**

Vibgyor provides an exceptional platform for artistically inclined students to develop their talents. The society actively participates in inter-college festivals within the University of Delhi, winning nearly a hundred prizes in a single academic year. Vibgyor organizes several competitive events annually, fostering a vibrant community of artists.







#### **TEDX SHIVAJI COLLEGE**

TEDxShivajiCollege connects and gives a platform to speakers with ideas that change perspectives and promote engaging, thought-provoking conversations. TEDx events feature a combination of TED Talk videos and live presentations to inspire new possibilities and drive local action. TEDx's global motto, "Ideas Worth Spreading," aligns with the mission of Shivaji College – "Transform one life, transform the nation." Notably, only a select few colleges in the University of Delhi have successfully hosted TEDx events.

This year, the event was held on the theme "Kaleidoscope—Through the Lens of Infinite Possibilities." Like a kaleidoscope that reveals new patterns with every turn, the event celebrated diverse perspectives coming together to inspire fresh ideas and transformation.





#### **ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE**

The Environment and Sustainability Committee of Shivaji College is a cornerstone of the institution's commitment to environmental responsibility and sustainable development. The committee, working in close coordination with the college Eco Club, actively promotes ecological awareness and green practices among students, faculty, and staff. Its wide-ranging responsibilities encompass both infrastructural and community-based sustainability initiatives, positioning Shivaji College as a model green campus within the University of Delhi.

A major responsibility of the committee is the operation and maintenance of the college's 130 KLD Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) and 10 KLD Effluent Treatment Plant (ETP), which together ensure the efficient treatment and recycling of wastewater generated on campus. Treated water is reused for horticultural purposes, reducing the dependency on freshwater resources and promoting circular water management.

The college is also powered, in part, by renewable energy through the maintenance of a 75 KVA rooftop solar power system. This not only helps in cutting down the institution's carbon emissions but also reduces the overall electricity expenditure. In terms of waste management, the committee oversees an integrated system that includes a bio-composting unit, vermi-composting pits, and bio-bins to convert food and organic waste into nutrient-rich compost. This compost is effectively utilized in maintaining the college's gardens and green spaces, thereby closing the loop on organic waste.

Biodiversity conservation is another important function of the committee. The college maintains beautifully landscaped lawns, a wide variety of tree species, and a dedicated herbal garden featuring more than 40 species of medicinal plants. These green spaces not only enhance the aesthetic appeal of the campus but also serve as live laboratories for environmental learning and awareness.

The committee arranges for conducting regular green audits and energy audits through certified agencies to assess and continuously improve the environmental performance of the campus. These audits help in identifying gaps, setting benchmarks, and guiding future sustainability initiatives. Through its consistent and innovative efforts, the Environment and Sustainability Committee contributes significantly to building a culture of sustainability at Shivaji College, empowering the stakeholders.

#### **INCLUSION COMMITTEE**

The Inclusion Committee of Shivaji College caters to the need of promoting the idea of inclusivity in the campus. The Enabling Unit, the North East Cell, and the Centre for Promotion of Inclusivity jointly function together under the



rubric of the Inclusion Committee. The joint effort of students and faculty members of the committee helps in creating a sensitized environment of equality, empathy and acceptance of diversities in the campus and beyond.

The Committee also actively organizes various events and activities to stimulate the minds of the students and faculty alike towards nurturing a consistent awareness to build a more informed and sensitized space in the campus.

#### **NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)**

The NSS of the college is a mix of the potential of teachers and students, who work in close tandem to evolve intellectually, socially, and morally. It follows a multi-pronged strategy. At one level, the directives of the state are addressed by students, according to notifications received by the University, with renewed energy. At another level, the NSS unit believes in organizing activities of various kinds, be it student competitions, outreach exercises, excursions, online campaigns, theatrical plays, and so on, in order to train NSS-registered volunteers to become responsible citizens. The motto of NSS at Shivaji College is Nishkaam Karma, and the indefatigable energy of the principal, Prof. Virender Bhardwaj, adds multiple dimensions to its activities.





### **NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)**

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) Unit of Shivaji College comprises a committed group of students trained in leadership, discipline, and service. The Boys' Divisonis affiliated with the 2 Delhi Battalion, ITI PUSA, New Delhi, and the Girls' Wing is associated with the 7 Delhi Girls Battalion, Kirti Nagar.

Our cadets actively participate in various regional and national camps and have consistently earned accolades, bringing honour to the college. They gain exposure to prestigious training opportunities such as the Republic Day Camp, Army Attachment Camp, Thal Sena Camp, Mountaineering, Trekking Expeditions, and Parasailing Camps.



N.C.C. training also serves as a valuable gateway to a career in the armed forces. Cadets who earn the prestigious 'C' Certificate are eligible for direct entry to the Services Selection Board (S.S.B.) interviews, with reserved vacancies available at the Indian Military Academy (IMA) and Officers Training Academy (OTA).

Additionally, 'C' Certificate holders receive priority consideration for recruitment in the Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) such as the BSF, CRPF, and ITBP. They are also awarded bonus marks or weightage in various recruitment examinations conducted by the UPSC (CDS), State Public Service Commissions, Police Services, and other central and state government job sectors.

Furthermore, N.C.C. cadets often benefit from preferential treatment in university admissions and are eligible for a range of government scholarships, recognizing their discipline, leadership, and service commitment. Enrollment is open to medically fit students at the beginning of the academic session. Interested students may apply and contact the N.C.C. in-charges Lt ( Prof.) Rajinder Singh (Boys Division) and Lt ( Dr) Deepti ( Girls Wing) for the enrolment process.

#### PLACEMENT AND INTERNSHIP CELL

Shivaji College has a very active Placement and Internship Cell that works round the year to provide internship and employment opportunities to its students. The cell also organises skill development workshops, and seminars on various topics like soft skills, resume writing, personality development, interview skills and other skills for employment and future career options in India and abroad. These workshops and seminars also give students ample insight into scenarios prevailing in the current job market. Students can register themselves for placements/internships through the link provided on the college website. The cell also coordinates with the Central Placement Cell of University of Delhi to ensure that students also have access to opportunities provided by the companies that visit the University Campus. In various on campus drives held in the session 2024-25 our students were placed in many companies namely Deloitte, Accenture, Cognizen Innovation, D.E. Shaw India, Wayspire Edtech Private Ltd., Astrotalk, QX Global Group, Easy Trip Planners (easemytrip), Bajaj Capital, Britannia Industries Ltd. and many others. There were more than 100 companies who participated in the placement and Internship fair this year. The Placement and Internship Cell encourages students to take up internships during summer break as it gives them industry exposure and makes them ready for placements. The Cell organises placement and internship fair every year in the college that provides ample opportunities to the students.



#### **PRINCIPAL INTERNSHIP SCHEME 2024-25**

#### **SUMMER INTERNSHIP 2024**

Shivaji College successfully launched its inaugural Summer Internship 2024 as part of the Principal Internship Scheme (PIS) 2024-25, aiming to provide students with practical and experiential learning during their summer vacations. From a pool of applicants, 50 undergraduate students were initially shortlisted based on their CGPA and subsequently underwent a selection process comprising an MCQ test, group discussion, and interview, ultimately leading to the selection of 15 interns. These selected students were assigned tasks across the Administration, Accounts, and Library Departments. The internship, which offered a remuneration of ₹6,000 per student for 120 hours of work, commenced on June 24, 2024, and concluded successfully on July 31, 2024, with all 15 interns completing their assignments. In keeping with the tradition, this year the summer internship once again successfully selected 15 passionate students to be a part of this exclusive opportunity.

#### **ACADEMIC SESSION INTERNSHIP 2024-25**

Following this, the Academic Session Internship under PIS 2024-25 began on September 20, 2024, engaging a total of 28 students from various academic streams. This internship included 8 internships in the college office, filled through an application process, and 20 departmental internships, and filled based on recommendations from respective departments. The final selection for the academic session internships was determined by CGPA, an MCQ test, and a personal interview. These interns completed their 200-hour assignments by March 31, 2025, each receiving a remuneration of ₹12,000. Overall, both internship programs proved instrumental in bridging the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical application, enabling students to apply their learning in real-world scenarios. Furthermore, the internships fostered the development of crucial technical and soft skills, including communication, teamwork, and problem-solving, thereby enhancing the interns' resumes and improving their employability. The Principal Internship Scheme annually provides summer and academic session internship opportunities to the students.

#### **RAJBHASHA COMMITTEE**

The Rajbhasha Karyanvayan Samiti or Rajbhasha Committee at Shivaji College serves as a responsible body for the implementation of Rajbhasha within the college. It evaluates the implementation of Rajbhasha among the teachers, students, and non-teaching staff of Shivaji College and also plays a leading role in ensuring compliance with the directives of the Rajbhasha Vibhag, Ministry of Home Affairs.

It is noteworthy that Shivaji College stands among the selected colleges of the University of Delhi that have successfully completed its inspection before the prestigious Parliamentary Rajbhasha Karyanvayan Samiti, chaired by the Honourable Member of Parliament, Shri Bhartruhari Mahtab, with a tenure of two years, and has received some important directives and suggestions from the distinguished Parliamentary Committee.

The Rajbhasha Karyanvayan Samiti of Shivaji College takes pride in being the inaugural member of the Nagar Rajbhasha Karyanvayan Samiti among all the colleges of the University of Delhi, leading by example. This committee continuously encourages the implementation of Rajbhasha among students, teachers, and staff within the institution. Under the leadership of our Principal, Professor Virender Bharadwaj, the Rajbhasha Committee organises significant annual programmes focused on Rajbhasha Hindi, including writing competitions, Hindi language teaching through the website, workshops, and Hindi signature campaigns. Detailed reports of these activities are shared regularly on the college website and with Narakas Delhi Madhya.

Last year, Shivaji College ensured its active participation in the All-India Rajbhasha Conference held in Pune under the esteemed chairmanship and presence of the Honourable Home Minister, Shri Amit Shah. On 26 May 2025, in the important meeting of Narakas Delhi Madhya chaired by the Honourable Vice-Chancellor of Jamia Millia Islamia University, Professor Mazhar Asif; Shivaji College

participated as the sole representative college from the University of Delhi. During the meeting, the Nodal Officer and Convenor of the Rajbhasha Karyanvayan Samiti presented the half-yearly report on the implementation of Rajbhasha at Shivaji College to the Honourable Chairperson and the Joint Director of the Rajbhasha Vibhaq, Ministry of Home Affairs.

In this great endeavour of nation-building, every member of the Rajbhasha Karyanvayan Samiti at Shivaji College—be it teacher, student, or staff—enthusiastically contributes to igniting the torch of Rajbhasha implementation. They ensure that future generations remain connected to their linguistic heritage and strive with enthusiasm to awaken this consciousness among others.

#### REMEDIAL CELL OF SHIVAJI COLLEGE

The Remedial Cell of Shivaji College is a dedicated initiative to provide academic support to students who may be facing challenges in coping with their coursework. This cell plays a vital role in promoting inclusive education by addressing the diverse learning needs of students and ensuring that no learner is left behind due to academic difficulties. The Remedial Cell organizes special classes, doubt-clearing sessions, and mentoring programs to help students improve their understanding of subjects and enhance their academic performance. These sessions are conducted by experienced faculty members and are tailored to focus on core concepts, revision of the syllabus, and preparation for examinations. In addition to academic guidance, the cell also offers counselling and motivation to help students build confidence and overcome learning challenges. The Remedial Cell works in close coordination with all the departments and the college's academic bodies to identify students in need and offer them timely support. Through its student-centric approach, the Remedial Cell contributes to the college's mission of fostering a supportive and equitable learning environment, enabling all students to realize their academic potential.

#### SHIVAJI ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT CENTRE (SAEC)

The Shivaji Academic Enrichment Centre of the college aims for students' holistic development by enhancing learning opportunities and fostering critical thinking, creativity, and problem-solving abilities. Round the year, SAEC organises activities that engage and motivate students under its three subcommittees: DISHA, SPADE, and Literary Society.

DISHA: The Civil Services Society of Shivaji College organizes various activities to assist Civil services aspirants in their exam preparation and keep students informed about current affairs. # GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION UNDER UGCF 2025-26



#### **CUET (UG) - 2025 REQUIREMENTS:**

Admission to all Undergraduate Programs at the University of Delhi is based on the scores obtained in CUET (UG) 2025, except for admissions to the School of Open Learning (SOL), Non-Collegiate Women Education Board (NCWEB), and for Foreign Nationals.

#### **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

- The candidate must have studied and passed Class XII examination or its equivalent from a single recognized board.
- The candidate must have studied and passed Class XII examination of any Board / University in India, or any foreign country recognized as equivalent to the 10+2 system by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
- For admission to University of Delhi, it is mandatory for the candidate to appear in CUET (UG) 2025 in those subjects in which s(he) is appearing/has passed Class XII. In case the subject studied at Class XII is not mentioned in the CUET (UG) 2025, the candidate must appear in the Language/Domain Specific subject that is similar/closely related to the subject s(he) has studied at Class XII (for example, if a candidate has studied Biochemistry in Class XII, s(he) must appear in Biology in CUET (UG) 2025). For establishing similarity of CUET (UG) subjects with subjects taken in Class XII, at least 50% of the syllabus of should match. The University reserves the right for establishing the similarity. The decision of university in this regard shall be final and binding.

#### **ADMISSION PROCESS**

- Allocation and admission will be based only on the combination of Language/s, Domain Specific Subjects and/or General Aptitude Test (GAT) in which a candidate has appeared in CUET (UG) 2025 as per the respective Program-Specific Eligibility.
- Only the scores obtained in CUET (UG) 2025 will be considered for admissions to the academic year 2025-26.
- The candidate must read the Program-Specific requirements carefully and then appear in Language and/or Domain Specific Subjects of the CUET (UG) 2025.

#### **APPLICATION AND ADMISSION GUIDELINES**

- © Candidates desirous of seeking admission to University of Delhi will also have to apply to University of Delhi's Common Seat Allocation System (UG)-2025. The details related to allocations and admissions through CSAS(UG)-2025 etc. will be notified separately on the website of University of Delhi.
- © Candidates must be careful while filling the CUET (UG)-2025 form as certain fields such as Name, signature and photograph of the candidate will be later auto-integrated by University of Delhi from CUET (UG)-2025. These fields will be non-editable.
- The name of the candidate claiming reservation must match with the Candidate's name as it appears on his/her corresponding school board qualifying certificates and in CUET (UG)-2025. Similarly, the parents' names must also match in the certificates.
- As per Ordinance-I of University of Delhi, there is no minimum age bar for admission to the undergraduate programs in the University and its colleges except in the programs where the respective regulatory bodies, such as Medical Council of India (MCI), All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), Bar Council of India (BCI), National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), Dental Council of India (DCI), etc. have prescribed the minimum age requirement in their regulations.
- Gap year will not be a bar for purpose of admission to undergraduate programs. However, such candidates must also appear in CUET (UG) 2025 for admissions in academic year 2025-26.

#### **RESPONSIBILITIES AND REQUIREMENTS**

- © Candidates are responsible for regularly checking the websites and admission portals of NTA and the University of Delhi for updates related to CUET (UG) -2025 and admission-related policies. Grievances resulting from not having consulted this bulletin and the website/s will not be entertained.
- Before registering for CUET (UG) 2025, the candidate is advised to carefully read the Bulletin of Information (BOI) 2025-26 and consult the University of Delhi Act, 1922, and the Statutes. The Ordinances, Rules, and Regulations of the University of Delhi, available on the University website, would be binding on them.

#### **DOCUMENT VERIFICATION AND COMPLIANCE**

- Non-compliance with any of the requirements for admission includes non-submission of relevant documents and/or non- payment of fees within the prescribed date and time. In that case, the applicants will lose their right to admission.
- If at any stage, original documents relating to a candidate's admission are found to be fake/non-genuine or fabricated, the concerned candidate will not be admitted and if already admitted, admission will be cancelled without any prior notice. No fee shall be refunded in such cases. If the same is found after completing the course, the candidate's degree will be cancelled and appropriate legal action will be taken against them.

# UNIVERSITY OF DELHI- ADMISSION THROUGH SUPERNUMERARY QUOTA

### PERSONS WITH BENCHMARK DISABILITIES (PWBD)

Five percent (5%) of the total sanctioned strength in each Program are reserved for PwBD candidates. Separate Allocation result/s will be declared for candidates seeking admission under PwBD quota. Candidates must ensure that the PwBD certificate is in the name of the candidate and issued by a recognized Government Hospital, bearing duly attested photograph of the candidate. Offers fee concessions.

### CHILDREN/WIDOWS OF PERSONNEL OF ARMED FORCES (CW)

Five percent (5%) of seats are reserved for Candidates under this category, program-wise in all colleges. Candidates desirous of taking admission under the CW quota of the University must appear in CUET (UG) - 2025. All such Candidates have to upload the Educational Concession Certificate (ECC) in specific format.

### **KASHMIRI MIGRANTS (KM)**

Upto 5% seats are reserved program-wise in all colleges for the wards of Kashmiri Migrants. All the wards of Kashmiri Migrants will have to upload a certificate of registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by Divisional Commissioner/Relief Commissioner. Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Kashmiri Migrants quota must appear in CUET (UG) - 2025.

### PRIME-MINISTER'S SPECIAL SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students must appear in CUET (UG) - 2025.

### **NOMINATION OF SIKKIMESE STUDENTS**

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Sikkim nomination scheme must appear in CUET (UG) - 2025. Sikkimese students nominated by the Govt. of Sikkim shall be considered for admission by the University in Colleges where hostel facilities are available.

### **WARD QUOTA (WQ)**

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Ward Quota of Employees of University of Delhi must appear in CUET (UG) - 2025. Admissions under ward quota for each college will be determined in three Program Clusters namely viz. Humanities, Commerce and Sciences. Candidates must be in possession of a valid Employment Certificate issued by due officials at the time of registration. Appropriate proration in CUET scores may be done to ascertain cluster-based merit.

### **ORPHAN QUOTA**

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the supernumerary Quota for Orphans must appear in CUET (UG) - 2025. A candidate who wishes to seek admission under the orphans quota must possess a certificate from a Govt. recognized Orphanage/Charitable Home or Death certificate of both the parents.

### **EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (ECA) AND SPORTS QUOTA**

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the supernumerary quota for ECA and/or Sports must appear in CUET (UG) - 2025. For admissions to ECA and Sports supernumerary seats a weightage of 25% will be given to CUET score and 75% to certificates/trials/performances.

### SINGLE GIRL CHILD

O1 (One) seat in each Program of every college is reserved under the Supernumerary Quota for a single girl child. The Parent/Guardian (in case parents are deceased) will have to declare that the girl child is the only Child of the parents have no other Male/Female child other than the girl child for which the application is being submitted for admissions in the academic session 2025-26. ### **DEPARTMENT OF BIOCHEMISTRY**

The B.Sc. (Hons.) Biochemistry Course provides a comprehensive understanding in the areas ranging from basic biochemistry to applied research. The aim of the course is to provide advanced learning in the biological sciences and help them to explore diverse opportunities in academia, research, and

beyond. The department focuses on the objectives of National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, which has been implemented in the Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF). ### **DEPARTMENT OF LIFE SCIENCES**

The Department of Life Sciences offers a comprehensive and interdisciplinary approach to the study of biological sciences. This dynamic department comprises three core disciplines: botany, or the plant sciences; zoology, or the animal sciences; and chemistry, or the chemical sciences. Being multidisciplinary, the students are dealing with three different disciplines of science, and the curriculum designed can instil an integrated science approach amongst students. Here, students are equipped to face the challenges of the modern scientific landscape while contributing to the advancement of knowledge in the living science.

The Department of Life Sciences stands as a beacon of academic excellence; its academic structure lays a strong foundation for students to succeed in their careers and helps them qualify for various entrance exams of national and international repute. During the various academic years of the course, in addition to the Discipline Specific Core (DSC) and Elective (DSE) courses, students will also learn numerous Generic Elective (GE), Value Added Courses (VACs), and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). Students here engage in both theoretical and practical learning, exploring topics such as taxonomy, physiology, developmental biology, ecology, genetics and molecular biology, biotechnology, research methodology, wildlife conservation, and all three domains of chemistry, viz. Organic, Inorganic and Physical Chemistry. In addition to curricular lectures, various departmental activities are organised, which include seminars, hands-on workshops, talks by industrial and academic experts, field trips, and visits to research institutes. The pedagogy employed ensures and fosters engaging and compelling learning experiences for the students. To ignite students' interest in exploratory aspects and develop research aptitude, the department involves students in short-term, in-house or intramural research projects and research-based outreach programs. To inculcate leadership qualities and managerial skills among students, the life science department has a robust, versatile, and active student council that organises various intra-college and inter-college departmental events for the wholesome participation of students.

Graduates from the Department of Life Sciences at Shivaji College, Delhi University, are well-prepared for diverse career paths in education such as school-level or university-level teaching & research, healthcare, civil services and sustainable environmental management. Additionally, under NEP-2020, students can attain a honours or major degree in any one of the three disciplines described above after completing the fourth academic year and having attained the required number of credits. The NEP-2020 also offers students the opportunity to obtain a degree with research after obtaining six essential credits through dissertation work in their fourth academic year. Therefore, students of life sciences can opt for any one discipline of interest and focus on it to complete their degree with a research component.

### **DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS**

The Department of Mathematics at Shivaji College consists of a team of highly qualified and dedicated faculty members with expertise in various areas of mathematics. The department actively promotes academic growth through seminars, student projects, and Add-on courses. ### **DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY**

Established in 1961, the Department of Zoology at Shivaji College has a rich legacy of academic excellence and student-centered learning. It became a fully independent department in 1973 and has since been offering a comprehensive curriculum in Zoology and related disciplines. The department caters to students enrolled in B.Sc. (Hons) Zoology, B.Sc. Life Sciences (Programme), and other subsidiary courses. With a strong academic foundation, the curriculum covers core subjects such as Non-chordates, Chordates, Comparative Anatomy, Physiology, Evolutionary Biology, Developmental Biology, Parasitology, Wildlife Conservation and Management, and Ecology, alongside modern fields including Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Immunology, Genetics, and Cell and Molecular Biology.

Under the Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF) 2022, in line with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the department emphasizes multidisciplinary learning, research-based education, skill development, and critical thinking to enhance innovation and employability among students. To complement theoretical knowledge with practical exposure, the department offers Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) such as Apiculture, Healthy and Sustainable Food Choices, Isolation of Genomic DNA, and Public Health, Hygiene, and Nutrition. These courses aim to develop technical skills and prepare students for diverse career opportunities in the life sciences sector. Additionally, Add-on Courses are offered to enrich student learning in areas of individual interest.

### **ORDINANCES XV-B**

### Maintenance of Discipline among Students of the University

(10062022\_University-Calendar-123-321.pdf)

- 1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor.
- 2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify on this behalf.
- 3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance, the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
  - a) physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and nonteaching staff of any institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi:
  - b) carrying of, use of, or threat to use of any weapons;
  - c) any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976;
  - d) violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
  - e) any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women;
  - f) any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner;
  - g) wilful destruction of institutional property;
  - h) creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds;
  - i) causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system; ragging as per Ordinance XV-C
- 4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor may, in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students
  - (a) be expelled; or
  - (b) be, for a stated period rusticated; or
  - (c) be not, for a stated period, admitted to a course or courses of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or
  - (d) be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
  - (e) be debarred from taking a university, college or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or
  - (f) that the result of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.
- 5. The Principals of the Colleges, Heads of the Halls, Deans of Faculties, Heads of Teaching Departments in the University, the Principal, the School of Correspondence Courses and Continuing Education, and Librarian shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students in their respective Colleges, Institutions, Faculties and Teaching Departments, in the University as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to, such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.

- 6. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself/herself with a copy of these rules.
- 7. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and the several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances, and the Rules that have been framed thereunder by the University.

#### **ORDINANCE XV-B**

### Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging

- Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of University of Delhi system as well as on public transport.
- Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which
  dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or
  students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual
  or collective acts or practices which
- Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force.
- Violate the status, dignity and honour of women students.
- Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste, tribe, and PWD.
- Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
- Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
- The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, or University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
- Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also Suo moto enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
- If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an iniquity, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
- When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
- On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years. University of Delhi Bulletin of Information.
- The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
- In case any students who have obtained degrees or diplomas of the University of Delhi are found guilty, under this Ordinance, appropriate action will be taken under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees or diploma conferred by the University.
- For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.

Non-students involved in reports of ragging will be proceeded with under the criminal law of India; they will also be rendered ineligible for a period of five years. from seeking enrolment in any of the institutions of the University of Delhi. Students against whom necessary action is taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice.

#### **ORDINANCE XV-D**

# The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (MINISTRY OF LAW AND JUSTICE)

An act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at workplace and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected there with incidental thereto. WHEREAS sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the Constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment; AND WHEREAS the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognized human rights by international conventions and instruments such as Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women, which has been ratified on the 25th June 1993 by the Government of India. AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions for giving effect to the said Convention for protection of women against sexual harassment at workplace.

#### ORDINANCE VIII-E: INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

(https://www.du.ac.in/du/uploads/rti/Annexure-VII.pdf)

[EC Resolution No. 60-1/ (60-1-13) dated 03.02.2023]

The assessment pattern that shall be adopted for the purpose of assessment of courses that have been approved by the Competent Authorities under the UGCF 2022 shall be as follows:

- In any course where O1 credit is attributed to Tutorial', an objective assessment process has to be developed as a credit earned by a student in a course will eventually lead to its deposition in the Academic Bank of Credit of such student. Therefore, it is imperative that each credit earned by a student is adequately assessed and recorded accordingly.
- In view of the above, the components of Tutorial have been listed so that at least some of these activities (listed at point no. 3 below) may be picked up by a student, in consultation with the teacher, as per rules devised for this purpose. The activities conducted shall be assessed through continuous assessment.
  - i) Some of the activities that may be done as component of tutorials are as follows:
    - Literature review
    - Book review
    - Movie review
    - Project activity (group)
    - Research cum presentation
    - Creative Writing/Paper writing
    - Group discussion
    - Problem Solving exercises

- ii) Further, out of forty marks allocated for Continuous Assessment of tutorial, five marks shall be for attendance, which shall be distributed as follows:
  - More than 67% attendance but less than 70% attendance 1 mark
  - More than 70% attendance but less than 75% attendance 2 marks
  - More than 75% attendance but less than 80 % attendance 3 marks
  - More than 80% attendance but less than 85% attendance 4 marks
  - More than 85 % attendance 5 marks

There shall not be marks for attendance in Continuous Assessments for practical.

- (i) Internal Assessment (IA) shall consist of marks secured in class tests, assignments/presentations and attendance. For instance, for an Internal Assessment of 25 marks, Class tests shall comprise of 10 marks, Assignments/Presentations shall comprise of 10 marks and attendance shall be for 5 marks. Similarly, for IA of 30 marks, 6 marks shall be for attendance, 12 marks for class test and 12 marks for Assignments/Presentations.
- (ii) Six marks for attendance shall be distributed as follows:
  - More than 67% attendance but less than 70% attendance 1.2 mark
  - More than 70% attendance but less than 75% attendance 2.4 marks
  - More than 75% attendance but less than 80 % attendance 3.6 marks
  - More than 80% attendance but less than 85% attendance 4.8 marks
  - More than 85 % attendance 6.0 marks

- (i) To make Internal Assessment and Continuous Assessment fair and reasonable, it is necessary to strengthen the Monitoring Committee for Internal Assessment in every College, constituted as per clause 5
- (ii) Ordinance VIII-E of the Ordinances of the University. This Committee shall be responsible for the entire process of Internal Assessment in the College, including redressal of grievances, if any. The same Committee shall also look into the process of Continuous Assessment and redress grievances, if any.
- (iii) A student who is discontent with the decision taken by the Monitoring Committee for Internal Assessment of the College, with respect to the grievance submitted by him/her relating to Internal Assessment/Continuous Assessment, may file an appeal before an appellate body consisting of the Principal of the College, the Teacher-incharge of the department/senior faculty member, the concerned teacher who has assessed the aggrieved student and shall be chaired by the Nominee of Dean of Colleges or Director South Delhi Campus, under whose jurisdiction the concerned College falls.

The theory examination and internal assessment shall be a cumulative assessment of the teaching-learning done in the theory as well as tutorial classes.

The assessment pattern for courses of different credit distributions is provided in Table -1

Practical marks for courses of total four credits, shall comprise of

- (i) continuous evaluation (25%),
- (ii) end term practical examination (50%) and
- (iii) viva-voce (25%).

Practical marks for courses of total two credits shall comprise of

- (i) continuous evaluation (25%),
- (ii) end term practical /written exam (50%) and
- (iii) viva-voce (25%)

The variance of the total marks in various combinations of LTP structure shall be aligned with the help of "weighted average" calculated through an appropriately devised formula for conversion of marks to grades.

"The attendance requirement for continuous mode of assessment shall be as per Ordinance VII of the Ordinances of the University".

### **Medical Certificates**

Medical certificates shall be excluded while calculating credit towards marks awarded for regularity, though such certificates shall continue to be taken into account for the purpose of calculating eligibility to appear for examinations as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2.9. (a)(ii).

<sup>\*\*</sup> In case of course of two credits which have Practical components, either there shall be end term Practical Examination or end term written examination.

# **Pass Percentage & Promotion Criteria**

The minimum marks required to pass any paper in a semester shall be 40% in theory and 40% in practical, wherever applicable. The student must secure 40% in the End Semester Examination and 40% in the total of the End Semester Examination & Internal Assessment of the paper for both theory and practical separately.

#### **Promotion from 1st Year to 2nd Year**

A student shall be eligible for promotion from the 1st year to the 2nd year of the course provided she/he has passed 50% of the papers of the I and 11 semesters taken together.

#### Promotion from 2nd Year to 3rd Year

Similarly, a student (irrespective of Part I results) shall be eligible for promotion from the 2nd year to the 3rd year of the course provided she/he has passed 50% of the papers of the III and IV semesters taken together.

# **Failing to Meet Promotion Criteria**

Students who do not fulfil the promotion criteria (as stated in points 10 and 11) shall be declared to have failed in the part concerned. However, they shall have the option to retain the marks in the papers in which they have secured pass marks as per Clause 9.

# Reappearing in examinations

A student who has to reappear in a paper prescribed for Semester 1/III/V may do so only in the semester examinations to be held in November/December. A student who has to reappear in a paper prescribed for Semester II/IV/VI may do so only in the examination to be held in April/May.

#### **Reappearance in Passed Papers**

A student may appear in any theory paper prescribed for a semester, foregoing in writing her/his previous performance in the paper(s) concerned. This can be done only in the immediate subsequent semester examination (for example, a student reappearing in a paper prescribed for the Semester I examination may do so along with the subsequent Semester III examination and not along with papers for Semester V).

#### Reappearance After Clearing Part III

A candidate who has cleared the papers of Part III (V & VI Semester) may reappear in any paper of V or VI Semester only once, at the immediate subsequent examination, foregoing in writing her/his previous performance in the paper(s) concerned, within the prescribed span period.

(Note: The candidate in this category will not be allowed to join any postgraduate courses).

#### **Result Preparation for Reappearance**

In the case of reappearance in a paper, the result will be prepared based on the candidate's current performance in the examination.

# Failure to Reappear After Opting

In the case of a candidate who opts to reappear in any paper(s) under the aforesaid provisions, on surrendering her/his earlier performance but fails to reappear in the paper(s) concerned, the marks

previously secured by the candidate in the paper(s) in which she/he has failed to reappear shall be taken into account while determining her/his result of the examination held currently.

# **Special Consideration for Participation in Activities**

In the case of a student who is selected as a member of the N.C.C. to participate in the annual N.C.C. Camps or is deputed to undertake Civil Defence work or allied duties, or in the case of a student who is enrolled in the National Service Scheme and is deputed to various public assignments by or with the approval of the Head of the institution concerned, or a student who is selected to participate in sports or other activities organized by the Inter-University Board or in national or international fixtures in games and sports approved by the Vice-Chancellor, or a student who is required to represent the University at the Inter-University Youth Festival, or a student who is required to participate in periodical training in the Territorial Army, or a student who is deputed by the College to take part in Inter College sports fixtures, debates, seminars, symposia, or social work projects, or a student who is required to represent the College concerned in debates and other extracurricular activities held in other Universities or such other activities approved by the Vice Chancellor, the following provision will apply:

- A student in the categories listed above will have to fulfil the requirement of written assignments and projects/term papers/seminars/fieldwork with the flexibility, however, that she/he may, if necessary, be allowed additional time for submission of written assignments.
- A student in the categories listed above, who is unable to write the House Examination/Class Test(s)/Quiz(s) on account of her/his participation in such activities, may be assessed by the College through an alternative mode. This may be done only in exceptional circumstances.
- A student in the categories listed above will get the benefit of attendance for Internal Assessment for the classes missed as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2. (9)(a)(I).

#### **Review and Moderation of Internal Assessment Marks**

The University reserves the right to review and, if necessary, moderate the marks in Internal Assessment in any paper/papers in any College/ Department. The information provided here is to the best of our knowledge. For further information, please refer to the University website www.du.ac.in.

### **Attendance Requirement**

Every student is required to attend not less than two-thirds of lectures and practicals delivered in the college separately for her/his course of study in each academic year.

#### **Consideration of Medical Certificates**

The Principal of the College may consider, on the basis of Medical Certificates produced, exceptional cases of students who had fallen seriously ill or had met with an accident. The University reserves the right to review and, if necessary, moderate the marks in Internal Assessment in any paper/papers in any College/Department.

#### **Exclusion of Lectures**

The benefit of exclusion of lectures contemplated in Ordinance VII.2. (9)(a)(i) above, either separately or jointly, shall in no case exceed one-third of the total number of lectures delivered. For further clarity, Ordinance VII should be consulted.
