Areas of Interest/Specialisation

My doctoral research is called "Textures of Exchange: the Maratha States, the Mughals and the English East India Company (mid-eighteenth to mid-nineteenth century)". This research looks at the political relationship among the three entities mentioned above through the agency of gifts exchange. I examine the labyrinth of exchange networks that characterized the late eighteenth-early nineteenth century India. The larger ambition is to look at the rise of British power in India beyond the binaries of rulers and traders and of victors and vanquished. There were subtle changes in the ways the cultural dimension of power was exercised during this period. A study of these exchanges and changes within them is crucial to understand the shift of power from the native rulers including the Mughal Emperor to the British. My doctoral research generated an interest in material culture studies and art history which I am pursuing at the moment.
