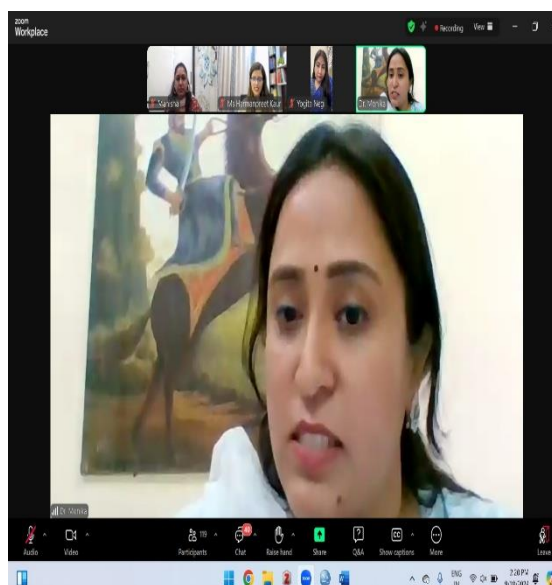
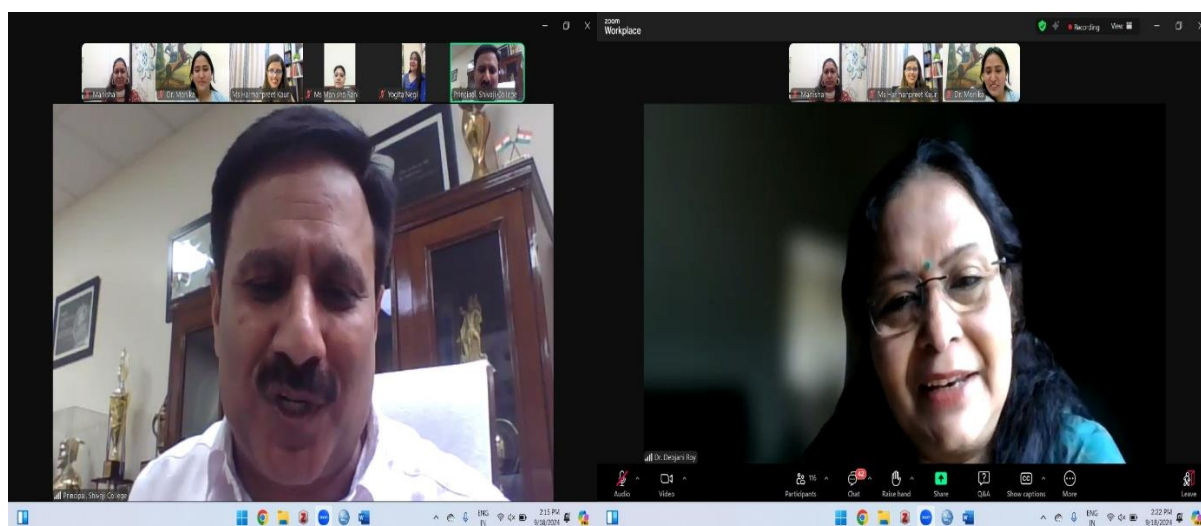

Activities by Department of Commerce

NEP Orientation and Sensitization Program

The Department of Commerce, Shivaji College, in collaboration with the Mahatma Hansraj Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre (MH-MMTTC), successfully conducted the NEP Orientation and Sensitization Program from September 18 to September 28, 2024.
